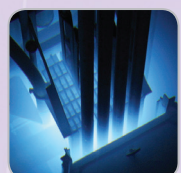

Message from KAIST/NEREC and SEJONG Institute

The ongoing Russo-Ukrainian war presents unprecedented challenges to the international system. These challenges demand global scale policy responses to address, to name a few, human rights, state sovereignty, fiscal crisis, rule of law, food security, energy security, supply-chain pressures, safety of nuclear power, and nuclear nonproliferation. The future of global development and the related geopolitics have become very complex adding to the difficulties caused by the Covid19 pandemic. While many countries are seeking opportunities to introduce nuclear power as nuclear newcomers given the concern over energy security and climate change, it is ever more important to seek safe and responsible use of nuclear technology.

This year's International Conference on Nuclear Nonproliferation will be held as a joint effort between Nuclear Nonproliferation Education and Research Center (NEREC) of KAIST and SEJONG Institute.
